

# CALLING ALL NEIGHBORS

## EMERGENCY OR DISASTER

We are stronger when we work together! During an emergency or when a disaster strikes, you can make a difference by checking on vulnerable neighbors to ensure they're safe.



### BE PREPARED

Have a plan for your household, including pets, in case your neighborhood is affected by an emergency or disaster.



### BE SAFE!

Ensure the safety of your family first, then check on neighbors.



### CHECK ON NEIGHBORS

Call, text or visit neighbors. Older adults, especially those who live alone, and those with disabilities or medical conditions are most at risk during emergencies and disasters.



### LEND A HAND

Ask how you can help. Offer to pick up groceries, medication, and other necessities your neighbor may need. If needed, make sure they have a way to evacuate.



### FIND LOCAL SERVICES

Call 211 or your county social services office to get information.
